



**Idaho Conservation Corps – AmeriCorps Conservation Intern  
Payette National Forest – Krassel Work Center,  
Near Yellow Pine, Idaho**

**Position Title:** Forestry Technician (Trails) South Fork – 450 HR

**Position Summary:**

The Payette National Forest is recruiting three Forestry Technician (Trails) summer interns from May 28<sup>th</sup> through August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The incumbent will be paired with a Forest Service Employee as part of a trail crew clearing downfall and brush from multiple-use trails. This position will typically work 10 eight hour days on with 4 days off.

**Duties and Responsibilities:**

Interns will work as part of a trail crew clearing downfall and brush from multiple-use trails. Other duties will include tread reconstruction, bridge construction, and installing water diversion and tread stabilization structures. Maintenance of tools and trail related equipment. The position requires working and camping in remote areas in varying weather.

**Required Qualifications:**

- Willingness to work as part of a small team
- The crew is generally self-supporting, carrying all personal supplies and equipment in loads up to 65 pounds or more, up to 15 miles per day in remote settings
- A high level of fitness is required
- Positive attitude
- Ability to work outdoors in remote settings and inclement weather on uneven ground

**Desired Qualifications:**

- Camping and Backpacking Experience

**Duty/Housing Location:**

Krassel Work center and in the field. Common kitchen and shared bedroom/bathroom. The work center is relatively remote on the South Fork of the Salmon River, approximately 40 miles from a major grocery store (McCall, ID).

**Terms of Employment:**

One AmeriCorps member will complete a term of service (length dependent on commitment of hours), starting May 28<sup>th</sup> through August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The member must complete a minimum of 450 service hours by the end of their term.

**Program Benefits:**

\$3,125.00 living allowance, prorated on a pay period (monthly) basis, a \$1,566.14 education award upon completion of the 450 hours of service. The incumbent will receive training in CPR/First Aid & defensive driving. Housing is provided.

The living allowance and education award are taxable. Members are responsible for providing their own food. Service eligibility is contingent upon the results of a criminal and driving background check.

The member will not engage in any prohibited activities as stated in the Member Service Agreement.
